Prof. Khurram Mustafa, external member could not attend the meeting as he was out of India. At the outset the chairman, welcomed the members of the committee and asked Dr. Pradeep Kumar to raise the situational context of the department. The agenda items were discussed thoroughly at length and the committee resolved the issues as follows:

Item No. 7.01: Conversion of Credit based Grading System (CBGS) into Choice based Credit System (CBCS): Department was following the Credit Based Grading System since the Academic Year 2012. As per UGC direction (D.O.No.20-104/2014-Desk U), to enhance the efficiency and adoptability in all institution and Universities in higher education the uniform Choice Based Credit system (CBCS) need to be adopted. Hence, the Department of CS&IT agreed to adopt CBCS with effective from new academic session 2015-16. The board members appreciated and agreed the recent updation of choice based credit system. (Annexure-7.01)

Item No. 7.02(a): Nomenclature and Renaming of the Program: Department of CS&IT started B.Tech.-M.Tech (Computer Science & Engineering) Integrated programme in 2013. However, based on the existing structure of **Department of Computer Science & Information Technology**, the board members suggested that stream should be Computer Science in place of Computer Science & Engineering. As per the latest Gazette notification for specification of degrees, July 5, 2014, program name shall be **Integrated B.Tech. –M.Tech. in Computer Science**, 6 years. The board members resolved the agenda item unanimously. . (Annexure-7.02a)

Item No. 7.02(b): Coding scheme: Department of CS&IT proposed the subject code scheme of Integrated B.Tech.-M.Tech. Programme. The codes for project work at Bachelor's level are changed to BTD71 and BTD81. The codes for dissertation at Master's level are changed to MTR31 and MTR41 for dissertation work in part-1 and part-2 respectively (Annexure-7.02b).

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Item No. 7.03: Minor revision at PG and UG Level and detailed syllabus: Department of CS&IT proposed the revised curriculum and detailed syllabus of the Integrated B.Tech.–M.Tech. Programme in 7th BOS meeting, which was resolved by the board members (Annexure-7.03).

Item No. 7.04: MCA curriculum and syllabus: Department of CS&IT proposed minor changes in old MCA curriculum and syllabus which was discussed thoroughly and resolved with minor changes (Annexure-7.04).


Item No. 7.05: Proposal for starting M.Tech (Computer Science): Department of CS&IT proposed Two-Year Full-Time/Four-Semester M.Tech program in Computer Science with effective from academic session 2015-2016. The board members recommended and forwarded the proposal for the approval (Annexure-7.05).

Item No. 7.06: Writing Examinations in Urdu or English: Keeping in view of larger interest of student community as their exposure in Software Industry, the committee members felt the necessity of writing sessional and semester examination papers either in English or Urdu. However, writing papers in English, the students will be able to get opportunity in various Multi-National Companies (MNCs) in the field of IT and Software industry round the globe. Further, it would open many doors for the students to become a potential aspirant for cracking down aptitude, reasoning and other pre placement activities laid down by the MNCs for better employability of our students. The proposal was appreciated by all the board members unanimously and accepted for the betterment of students' professional career point of view.

Other Agenda items with permission of chair:

1. In order to minimise the gap between existing curriculums of professional courses and other organisations promoting Urdu Literature such as Deen-e-Madaris, the board members suggested to introduce a bridge course of two/three semesters for students of Deen-e-Madaris and other similar Madarsas in the country. The purpose of such bridge course is to prepare the students to the level of regular students studying in first semester of the Integrated B.Tech.–M.Tech. Programme so that students coming from Madarsa background can map with technical courses at UG level. The duration of bridge course shall be treated as zero year periods to bridge the aptitude level of the Madarsa students in different subjects like physics, chemistry, mathematics and other elementary subjects. However, designing the syllabus of bridge courses need to be discussed and deliberated at higher level of academic councils for further proceedings.
2. Keeping in view of scarcity and availability of examiners who can evaluate PhD thesis report scripted in URDU language particularly in domain of Computer Science and Information Technology, the board members unanimously suggested to write the PhD thesis in English as well as in Urdu. Although, both scripted copy of PhD thesis may be submitted separately.
