At the outset, the Chairman extended warm welcome to all the members of School Board. The copy of attendance-sheet is enclosed. (Annexure-Attendance).

8.1 Confirmation of the Minutes of 7th School board meeting, School of Technology:

The Chairman informed that minutes of 7th School Board meeting of School of Technology held on 09/12/2020 were circulated among the board members. Minor suggestions received from the

external board members which were incorporated and subsequently minutes of 7th School Board considered as confirmed. (Annexure 8.1)

8.2. Items for consideration

8.2.1 Restoration of Diploma in Apparel Technology course at MANUU Polytechnic Kadapa and Diploma in Automobile Engineering course at MANUU Polytechnic Cuttack.

This year, an overwhelming response was received from the local body and keen interest shown by the aspirants willing to pursue Diploma engineering in Apparel Technology at MANUU Polytechnic Kadapa and Diploma engineering in Automobile Engineering at MANUU Polytechnic Cuttack. The board members discussed the matter thoroughly and resolved that in view of the larger interest of stakeholders and to uplift the oppressed section of society, the board members Prof. Abdul Qayoom Ansari Professor Mohd. Shahid, Prof Bashir Alam and Professor Ehtesham Ahmed Khan emphasized the need for restoration of diploma engineering in apparel technology and automobile engineering at the respective polytechnics Kadapa and Cuttack with effect from the next academic year deploying contractual faculty members initially. Further, it was resolved unanimously that a representation cum request letter shall be written to the UGC to restore the above two courses citing the increase in demand and for the larger benefits of the society.

8.3 Adoption of Evaluation Scheme for Theory Courses, Practical Courses, Summer Internship / Projects / Seminar and Mapping of Marks to Grades as per AICTE Model Curriculum 2019 for all MANUU Polytechnics (Diploma Courses in Engineering) from the current Academic Year 2020-2021

8.3.1 Evaluation Scheme for Theory and Practical Courses

In view of AICTE Model Curriculum 2019 for all Polytechnics (Diploma Courses in Engineering) from the current Academic Year 2020-2021, the weightage of Internal assessment is 60% and for End Semester Exam is 40% respectively. The student has to obtain at least 40% marks individually both in internal assessment and end semester exams to pass. Total marks for 2-credit course shall be 50 and for the courses with more than 2-credits total marks shall be 100 for all diploma courses in engineering.

8.3.3 Mapping of Marks to Grades as per AICTE Model Curriculum 2019

Further, In view of Grades as per AICTE Model Curriculum 2019 for all Polytechnics (Diploma Courses in Engineering) from the current Academic Year 2020-2021, each course (Theory/Practical) is to be assigned 100 marks, irrespective of the number of credits, and the mapping of marks to grades may be done as per Table2. The committee members after detailed discussions and deliberations resolved that the above Examination evaluation scheme of AICTE shall be implemented (internal and external weightage) in all the MANUU Polytechnic's as it is from the academic year 2020-2021. Prof. Abdul Qayoom Ansari opined that, AICTE's main purpose is to have a uniform Model curriculum and examination scheme for all Diploma in Technical Courses all over India. Different states has different Technical Boards with different distribution of marks and grading systems, therefore by implementing the AICTE Model curriculum and examination scheme for Diploma in Technical Courses, the MANUU students will not have to face problems for enrolling in higher education and also for applying in Government or Private sector Jobs. The chairman informed the committee members, that the MANUU Polytechnics have started implementing the AICTE Model curriculum from the academic year 2020-21. The committee after detailed discussions and deliberations resolved that the above Examination evaluation scheme (Examination reforms) of AICTE shall also be implemented in the entire MANUU Polytechnic's from the academic year 2020-21.

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
8.4 Seeking AICTE Approval for B.Tech (Computer Science), M.Tech, M.C.A and MANUU Polytechnic Kadapa and Cuttack Programs from the academic year 2020-2021.

The chairman briefed the committee about the various programs under School of Technology, their establishment years and AICTE approvals and also the preparations done for seeking AICTE Approval for our M.Tech, M.C.A and MANUU Polytechnic Kadapa and Cuttack Programs from the academic year 2021. Although, B.Tech (Computer Science) program has been already approved by the AICTE in 2015. Further, as per AICTE APH 2021-22, all the programs required AICTE approval and therefore no partial affiliation can be retained. In view of AICTE APH 2021-22, the board members appraised the decision of seeking the AICTE Approval for MANUU M.Tech, M.C.A and Polytechnic Kadapa and Cuttack Programs from the academic year 2020-21. Prof. Mohd. Shahid, the board member emphasized and strongly opined that in view of AICTE regulations, other MANUU Polytechnics at Darbhanga and Bangalore also need to get prepared for AICTE Approvals from the next academic year.

8.5 To approach UGC for Teaching and Technical posts and also for funds in order to fulfill the infrastructure requirements as per AICTE norms for the programs of School of Technology.

In order to comply with the desired norms and standards of AICTE, The committee members discussed and agreed in principle that it is essential to get the faculty (Teaching & Technical) posts sanctioned and other essential requirements from the UGC and also the funds for infrastructure development for running the programs of the School of Technology smoothly in near future to fulfill the required norms laid down by the AICTE and UGC respectively. In this connection Prof. Abdul Qayoom Ansari opined that, we have to ask the UGC for funds for the bare minimum mandatory requirements and also humbly informing UGC that, without these requirements we are not going to get the AICTE approvals.
