

The 'Viksit Bharat 2047' agenda is a comprehensive vision plan envisioned by the Government of India, aiming to transform India into a developed nation by the year 2047, marking the 100th anniversary of its independence. The Government of India has launched numerous initiatives, including "Viksit Bharat: Voice of The Youth" and "Amrit Kaal Vimarsh: Viksit Bharat@2047," with an aim to gather the suggestion and views of different stakeholders.

In this regard, a background note containing document on 'Viksit Bharat@2047 Sectoral Visions' (**Annexure-I**), a Standard Operating Procedure, template for Seminar/workshop for structuring the workshop (**Annexure II**) and an indicative form for obtaining feedback from different stakeholders (**Annexure III**) is enclosed herewith for compliance.

Central University of Rajasthan has been appointed as a Nodal Institute for all the Central Universities to analyze and consolidate the ideas/suggestions provided by the stakeholders and youth during the workshops which shall be further submitted to the Ministry.

In pursuant to the above, all the Dean of Schools is hereby requested to conduct the workshops/seminars aligned with the vision document and provide a write up of 100 words on each along with the ideas collected from the stakeholders on Viksit Bharat@2047 as per the format enclosed. **Record of Discussion of Virtual Meeting held on 07.03.2024 at 3:00 PM with Heads of Centrally Funded Institutions on Viksit Bharat @ 2047.**

A Virtual Meeting was held on 07.03.2024 at 3:00 PM under the Chairmanship of Secretary (Higher Education) with Heads of Centrally Funded Institutions to discuss about Viksit Bharat @ 2047. The meeting was attended by around 130 Heads and their representatives from 107 Centrally Funded Institutions (IITs, NITs, CUs, IISc & IISERs). List of officers of the D/o Higher Education who attended the meeting is attached at Annexure.

2. At the outset, Secretary, D/o Higher Education, M/o Education welcoming the participants, briefed about agenda of the meeting related to deliberation and discussion by the Higher Education Institutions (HEIs) on Viksit Bharat @ 2047 document. Secretary informed all HEIs that discussion on vision document for 2047 was started two years back with different stakeholders including HEIs. He urged the HEIs to organise workshops/seminars with students, faculty members, industry bodies, other stakeholders for suggestions feedbacks for development of Viksit Bharat @ 2047 documents. Secretary reiterated that these deliberations need to be seen in continuation of past deliberations like 'Viksit Bharat Vimarsh', 'Viksit Bharat @2047: Voice of Youth' etc.

3. Ideas emanating from the stakeholders to be collated for suitable incorporation in vision document of Viksit Bharat @ 2047. Secretary (HE) requested Shri Govind Jaiswal, JS for presentation on the template of consultation and workshop to be conducted by HEIs.

4. Shri Govind Jaiswal, JS, DoHE made a brief presentation mentioning suggestive template with questions to be captured while conducting workshop at HEI level. Nodal institutions for different categories of HEIs have been identified, which may have meetings with respective category of HEIs to decide way forward and to deliberate on key issues like standardising the format for collection of data, categorisation of ideas/suggestions and output documents, etc., and will analyse and collate before sending to MoE.

5. Secretary, D/o Higher Education in his intervention mentioned that the institutions may conduct panel discussion, micro-level workshop on various topics and collate all ideas for Viksit Bharat @ 2047. The nodal institutions may have a meeting amongst themselves to finalise key issues like standardising the format for data collection, categorisation of ideas/suggestions and output documents. He also emphasised that the ideas and suggestions shall not be limited to education sector but across all sectors. Categories-wise nodal institutions shall be as follows: -

- CU Rajasthan for Central Universities
- NIT Surathkal for NITs
- IISER Berhampur for IISERs
- IIT Madras for IITs
- IIIT Nagpur for IIITs
- IIM Kozhikode for IIMs

6. Secretary directed that an online meeting with IIITs and IIMs may also be organised for briefing, as they could not be invited for this meeting.

7. A background note containing document on 'Viksit Bharat@2047- Sectoral Visions', Standard Operating Procedure and Template for Seminar / workshop for structuring the workshop and for obtaining feedback will be sent (copy enclosed).

8. Secretary also observed that Bureau Heads will interact with respective heads of Nodal Institutions for timely and effective roll out of consultation and workshop.

9. The meeting ended with vote of thanks.

## Introduction

The 'Viksit Bharat 2047' agenda is a comprehensive vision plan by the Government of India, aiming to transform India into a developed nation by the year 2047, marking the 100th anniversary of its independence. India is at a turning point in its history. The 21st century will be India's century, as the country pole-vaults into the future confident of its capabilities.

India has demonstrated quantum leap capabilities across areas such as Healthcare, Education, Digital Public Infrastructure etc.

Government of India launched numerous initiatives, including "**Viksit Bharat: Voice of The Youth**" and "**Amrit Kaal Vimarsh: Viksit Bharat@2047**," with an aim to gather the suggestion and views of different stakeholders on various aspects of development, including economic growth, social progress, environmental sustainability, and good governance. These activities have seen active participation from various universities and colleges, where students have contributed their ideas and perspectives on their roles in shaping the Viksit Bharat by 2047. Government also deliberated with various stakeholders such as NITI AAYOG, Ministry of Education and other entities and have drafted a document - **Viksit Bharat@2047 Sectoral Vision (Annexure A)**

As India stands at this crucial juncture, poised to take off on its growth trajectory, it is important to realize that tremendous dedication and belief in India's destiny, immense desire, potential, talent and capabilities of the Indians, especially the youth, coupled with steadfast leadership, is necessary to realize this potential. Therefore, **it is necessary to engage youth in preparation of vision documents and include their aspirations, ideas and suggestions in Viksit Bharat vision document.**

To capture youth vision and ideas, All Higher Education Institutes shall deliberate on vision document and identify focus area such as **Holistic, Quality & Affordable health and Wellness for All, Education and Skilling for the Future, Naari Skati -Women-led Development, Caring and Inclusive Society, Employment and labour, Vibrant Culture and Heritage, Empowered Youth, Sports for Life and Global Excellence and thriving and Sustainable Economy etc.** HEIs are also expected to contribute general and the specific suggestions on overall document. **All HEIs are required to consolidate ideas of youth, subject matter experts, industry, academia and students.**

To generate ideas, it's essential to organize a **series of focused, micro-level workshops** at the university level, which should then lead into a **final and comprehensive workshop.** These workshops would represent a forward-thinking approach to involve the youth in national development mission. The workshop must incorporate the perspectives of

students with an aim to catalyse significant transformations in the identified sectors, aligning with the vision Viksit Bharat@2047.

SoP (Annexure B) and feedback format (Annexure C) for the Institutes has been prepared and annexed.

Ministry has also identified the nodal institutes (Annexure D) for consolidation of all the ideas/suggestions provided by the stakeholders and youth during the workshops. These nodal institutes will analyse and consolidate all suggestions received and will submit to Ministry.
