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INTRODUCTION

Corporate Social Responsibility refers to ensuring the success of a business by the inclusion of social and environmental considerations into a company's operations. It means contributing positively to society. Corporate social responsibility (CSR) refers to business practices involving initiatives that benefit society. A business's CSR can encompass a wide variety of tactics, from giving away a portion of a company's proceeds to charity, to implementing "greener" business operations.

The World Business Council for Sustainable Development defines CSR as 'the continuing commitment by business to behave ethically and contribute to economic development while improving the quality of life of the workforce and their families as well as of the local community and society'. According to Philip Kotler and Nancy Lee (2005), CSR is defined as 'a commitment to improve community
