### Women and Livelihood:

## Reflections on entitlements, opportunities & challenges

#### **Abstract**

Women experience multiple identities and intersectionalities based on gender, caste, class, ethnicity, age and many more. There are several hidden social constraints that inhibit women's free choice of what they want to do. The same is the condition with their participation in income generation activities and struggle for livelihood.

The paper talks about livelihood of women as active agent in income generation activities. It is a reflection based on field level engagements in PRADAN (Professional Assistance for Development Action), a development organization. Here an attempt is made to develop a conceptual understanding from two vantage points. Firstly, process of livelihood intervention involving women and the subterranean inertia and obstruction from the patriarchal social structure. Secondly, to argue how strong and effective mechanism could foster empowerment of women leading to their effective participation in the process of not only income generation but also in decision making.

### Introduction

The provision and entitlement of livelihood is considered to be an imperative component under the Social Security and Human Rights framework of creating and promoting livelihood.
