Manuu Law School, Maulana Azad National Urdu University Hyderabad conducted the webinar on 'Comparative Analysis between Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita 2023 and Indian Penal Code, 1860(IPC)'.

Speaker Mr. Sankalp Sharma Advocate at Bombay High Court talked about the scope of amendments to BNS while drawing a comparative analysis with the existing IPC - Discussed various changes that are brought out to the criminal system, their genesis, implementation challenges and how they will impact when effectuated. Whether they can stand the test of courts, when in practice.

Discussed the framework that central agencies adopt while investigating offences under the PMLA, Companies Act, MCOCA - The twin conditions on bail and the latest position in law regarding bail of an accused. Offences of Sedition, Contained in Section 124-A of IPC, has been done away with, as also that of Adultery. Chapter 7 of Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita, on offence against State, essentially describes the crime of Sedition, expands its scope, leaving it wider open to police. what is required is to hold police accountable not just to the executive but also to a committee of the legislature and also to the Human Rights Commission.
